*A keynote address* by Carrie Douglass, Professor of Anthropology at Mary Baldwin College, USA, and author of *Barren States: The Population Implosion in Europe*. The title of her talk will be “Where Have All the Babies Gone? Low Fertility and Emerging Adulthood in Europe.”

*A debate* between Jeffrey J. Arnett, Clark University, USA, and Leo Hendry, Professor of Psychology, University of Glamorgan, Wales: “Emerging Adulthood in Europe: How Important is Social Class?”

*Topic lunches.* Conference participants will have the opportunity to meet in groups for lunch on Thursday (boxed lunches provided) to discuss issues of emerging adulthood arranged by topic (e.g., family relationships, education, mental health).
